Dale G. Larson, Ph.D. (U. C. Berkeley) is a Professor of Counselling Psychology at Santa Clara University, where he directs the graduate Health Psychology Program.

A national leader in end-of-life research, theory, and training, he co-directed a national mental health skills training program for hospice workers and was Senior Editor and a contributing author for *Finding Our Way: Living with Dying in America*, a national newspaper series which reached seven million Americans.

Dale Larson is a Fulbright Scholar, a Fellow in the American Psychological Association, a clinician, and author of the award-winning book, *The Helper's Journey: Working With People Facing Grief, Loss, and Life-Threatening Illness*. He publishes widely on grief and grief counselling, end-of-life issues, self-concealment, professional stress and stress management, and counselling skills, and worked directly with Gene Gendlin and Carl Rogers.

Dr. Larson's ability to translate theory and research into effective clinical practice makes him a popular speaker at national and international conferences. He recently gave keynote addresses for the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Care Medicine and for the Australian Psychological Society Counselling Psychology Conference in Melbourne. In 2016 Dr. Larson was honoured with the *Death Educator Award* by the Association for Death Education and Counselling.

These workshops can be done consecutively, as part of a two-day program or separately as individual workshops.

PROGRAM ONE:

Getting Grief Working: An Integrative Person-Centred Approach to Counselling for Grief and Loss

Our understanding of the grieving process and the needs of bereaved and traumatised person has advanced significantly in recent years. We now see grief as a natural condition, a human reaction to loss; that can generally be expected to abate over time and frequently leads to psychological growth. The role of grief counselling is to unblock or accelerate this natural healing process to get grief working, particularly if this process is moving more slowly than expected or if the reaction to a loss is severe or protracted.

Current models tell us that when grief is working, our clients zigzag flexibly between loss and restoration coping, negotiate tasks of mourning, maintaining continuing bonds, integrating their loss, finding meaning, constructing new life narratives, and if traumatically bereaved, both integrating trauma and accommodating loss. Clinical interventions designed to facilitate these and other client outcomes and change processes range from comprehensive multifaceted treatment programs to dozens of individual techniques widely practiced today.

This workshop presents a rationale for an integrative person-centred approach as the foundation for these grief counselling interventions and their general efficacy. In the work of Carl Rogers, and its extensions in the theory and practice of experiential focusing, emotion-focused therapy, motivational interviewing, and mindfulness-based approaches, we find both common factors and specific techniques that are finely attuned to the needs of bereaved persons, interventions which energize and support emotional processing and regulation, schema change, and client motivation.

In this highly interactive day together we will practice skills and view brief vignettes from sessions by Carl Rogers, leading emotion-focused therapists, and Dale Larson. We will explore the challenges that person-centred care with grieving, seriously ill, and traumatized clients presents for helping professionals. How can we be emotionally involved helpers without suffering from burnout and compassion fatigue? How can we be the compassionate guides who can assist clients to live with hope in a world in which loss is inescapable?

COURSES

Nationally Recognised Training

As a Registered Training Organisation (RTO No: 22004) ACGB currently offers two nationally recognised qualifications on its scope of registration: 22264VIC Graduate Certificate in Bereavement Counselling and Intervention and the 22271VIC Certificate IV in Bereavement Support.

These courses are accredited to ACGB and monitored by the national regulator, Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA).

Certificate IV in Bereavement Support - Online (22271VIC)

This self-paced online course can be completed in 6-12 months with students being supported by online tutors.

There are bimonthly intakes all through the year but employee group enrolments can be accommodated to have a their own preferred date to commence the program.

This fully online course is designed for those who have a role in providing bereavement and loss support. The skills and knowledge provided by the course may be for a specific bereavement support job role or complement other job roles, such as those of nurses, aged care workers, counsellors and social workers.

While bereavement care and support work is the main focus of the course, a holistic approach to industry activities is offered, with the content also incorporating communication, capacity building and quality management and explores specific workplace duties as found in the real workplace environment.

PROGRAM TWO:

Secrets in Grief Counselling and End-of-Life Care: Making the Invisible Visible

Working with people facing grief, loss, and life-threatening illness ushers us into a world of secrets. Secrets that are most tightly held, such as sexual abuse and other traumas, self-hatred, family secrets, suicidality, extramarital affairs, disenfranchised grief, and serious medical conditions are painful and often stigmatized experiences. These secrets reflect the core of clients' inner worlds--the places where they feel least loved and lovable, and most alone. Family secrets and cutoffs, often passed from generation to generation, can complicate mourning, produce the symptoms that bring families into our consulting rooms, and complicate movement toward closure at the end of life. Health professionals can also have helper secrets--self-doubts they are reluctant to share with colleagues, or unresolved feelings about difficult clinical situations. Finally, when diagnoses and prognoses are not openly discussed, secrets grow and make the transitions within treatment and therapy more difficult and hazardous. Navigating this world of secrets, and sensitively negotiating conflicts surrounding disclosure and the real-world constraints against it, are hallmarks of the effective end-of-life professional.

In this workshop we will explore secrets in everyday clinical practice and identify therapeutic techniques and relationship qualities that can bring the dialectic of concealment and disclosure, and the transformation of shame, into the center of therapeutic action. We will draw upon recent work in several areas: self-concealment and health; client secret keeping in therapy; secrets at the end of life; social constraints, stigma and disenfranchised loss; family secrets; trauma healing, the writing cure, and adaptive disclosure; ethical issues in the management of client secrets; helper secrets; and end-of-life conversations.

Grief Lecture 2017: “Love, Loss, Life” – Gail O’Brien.

As the wife of the late Professor Chris O'Brien (AO), Gail has played an instrumental role in supporting her husband's vision for Australia to have its own world-class, fully integrated and comprehensive cancer care facility.

Gail was by Chris' side from when he was initially diagnosed with brain cancer, until he passed away in 2009. It was soon after this time, she accepted a position as board member of the facility that now bears her husband's name.

Since that time, Gail has used her own experience and insights to address a wide range of corporate, industry and special interest groups about the new hope that lies ahead for the thousands of Australians each year who receive the news they have cancer.

Gail has a strong background in health. In addition to her role with Chris O'Brien Lifehouse, Gail is also a practicing physiotherapist, working within the hospital sector in the area of orthopaedic rehabilitation.

Gail originally trained as a physiotherapist at the NSW College of Paramedical Studies and was initially appointed to Royal Prince Alfred Hospital as a physiotherapy resident in 1976.

It was during this time she first met and then married Chris and in 1980 they travelled to the United Kingdom and United States to further his training in head and neck surgery.

Upon returning to Australia, Gail went on to manage Chris' busy practice from 1987 until 2006. During this time, Gail also helped Chris launch the Sydney Head and Neck Cancer Institute based at RPA, managing events and raising funds for their basic and clinical research programs on head and neck cancer. This work has continued in line with her involvement with Lifehouse.

Having been born into a medical family and working within the health sector during her career, Gail has always been fascinated by the world of medicine and what it can offer, particularly in the area of cancer care and treatment.

Her first-hand experience, knowledge, passion and understanding are invaluable to her continuing role with Chris O'Brien Lifehouse.

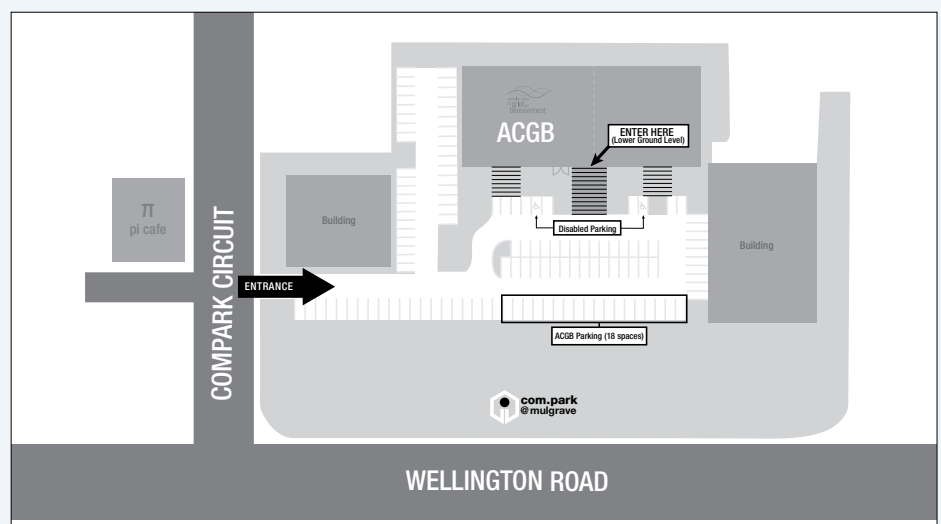
